at our general meeting held at the usual place a vote was passed relating to fences for regulating our Circular and partition fences for this precinct of hanuerstran and it is hereby agreed by the majority of the freeholders pursuant to an Act of the general assembly lately published to have the above said fences the height of it four foot two inches <sup>high</sup> and four or five <sup>rails</sup> from the bottom not to Exceed Eight inches apart and the other two proportioned to the height And also it was agreed by the like majority of freeholders that the hogs should run at large having sufficient yokes which orders rules and directions being entered upon this publick Register stands as a law until the above said freeholders see fit to alter all or any part of the said orders rules and directions

 Abraham Coles Ear mark with a Crope of the Right Ear and two slits in the same Ear Entered 30<sup>th</sup> March 1700

adonnam Prudens Ear mark half Crope of the Left Ear and Saw Tooth under the right Ear  
 peter vanhouster Jun<sup>r</sup> Ear mark a Swallow fork in the Left Ear Entered March ye 3<sup>d</sup> 1789

Ebenezer bishops Ear mark is a Swallow fork in the right Ear and a Crope of the left hand E B on the Left thigh Entered March ye 3<sup>d</sup> 1789

Jacob onderdonk Ear mark is a Swallow fork in the left Ear and a half penny the under side of the same Entered March ye 3<sup>d</sup> 1789
