

A Certain Road Laid out <sup>in the year</sup> the fourteenth of November 1779.

Beginning at the Garse line Eastward from Henry Conkling  
at a oak tree Standing near a Small Run of water running  
Eastwardly till it Comes to another run of water and running  
the old <sup>road</sup> to Luis Conkling house and running over the Creek  
Southwardly to the Corner of Scoots fence So along to the norward  
of Scoots house and So a Cross Scoots fields as the road is marked  
and from thence running as the trees Stand marked for the road  
Eastwardly till it Comes to the west Line of Cakiat Dallent  
then running Southwardly till it Comes to a line that runs  
Between Benjamin Osburn and a Lot that formerly belonged to  
Charlse moot Running Eastwardly along the line one rod on one lot  
and one rod upon the other lot So Running Eastwardly as the trees  
Stand marked for the road till it Comes into the old road to  
the norward of John Osburn the Road Containing two Rods  
in breadth
