

Only the fourth Day 1753 ————— 131

A Certain Road Laid out for James Johnson of the precinct of Harrostran and County of orange thro' a certain tract of Land which is called and known by the name of Stoney point Tract. which the tract of Land now belongeth to Harrek Lent which Road beginneth at a young black oak tree marked for the Road standing by Hutsons River the tree above said to be the South bound of the said Road the Road Running westerly into the woods as the tree stands marked for the said Road about two hundred Yards or thereabouts till it cometh to the Road which the said James Johnson hath cleared and used to Draw his wood to the River and Running along the said Road westerly as the Road Runs till it comes to line of marked trees formerly run for Stoney Point tract the said Road containing two Rods in breadth the Land so Laid out into a Road was viewed and surveyed by two Justices of the peace of the County of orange and twelve freeholders of the precinct of Harrostran who value the said Land Laid out into the Road at three pounds where the said James Johnson having payed with the Charges for the Jury and for Laying out the said Road and all other Charges according as the act Directs in such Cases and the said Land Laid out into a Road properly belongeth to James Johnson and his heirs and assigns for Ever

By a Request of the Surveyors whose names are here under written this Road is Entered upon this Book of Record this fourteenth Day of march - 1753
