Beginning at a small Chestnut tree marked on four sides it being the
Northwest Corner of Isaac Secars Land Running Eastwardly upon the Land
of John Smith till it comes to the Land of Abraham Blauvelt then
Running northwardly upon the Land of John Smith till it comes to
the Northeast Corner of John Smiths Land then Running Northward by a
Cross the Land of Isaac Coel then continuing the same Course till it
comes to the northeast Corner of Abraham Poldens Land the whole breadth
of the Road be upon the Land of the Id Polden then Running a Cross the
Land of Pulef and Jonas Vanhonters to a Corner Stake between Joseph
Inap and Benjamin Taylor following the Line till it comes to the Road
formerly Laid out this Road containing two Rods in width Laid out
by the Surveyors -

By a Request of the Surveyors whose names are under written this Road
is Entered upon this book of Record this Sixth Day of October 1755
by me Samuel Coe Clerk

March of 1770 then we Commissioners of the Highway
Laid out a Road Beginning at a Creek called Cule's Creek at a Landing
at a slow Place from that to a small Button wood plantation
So straight to a large Chestnut tree standing the east side of a hill
and goes up the hill to the top of a first hill to take a path
to turn from the turn to go southerly along the hill as near the edge
it conveniently can to have a road deck to be along of the hill
then goes towards George's Sings Sawmill So along the plain
it goes untill it comes to Sial Quens Corner from that up a hill
to a Chestnut Oak tree marked at the north side of the Road to a place
of beach untill it comes to Sigs' Clements Saw mill at a Place
Quensberry to the Road laid out at the above said landing is
four Rods wide above from the landing untill it comes to
of the hill to from thence a Road is laid out two Rods wide
to the above said Saw mill
