

February 10th 1772 there was given a Bill of Sale ^{given} to ¹⁵¹ James Wilson by Jonathan Gage for ye sum of fifteen Pounds fifteen Shillings & three Pence besides ye Coast, in which Bill of Sale said Gage Does Set over & Deliver unto said Wilson his Cart, Adm^r, & all his household goods. One Cow all his Lyeen Grain farming utencils & all his household goods. Said Gage has for time of Redemption of said Goods & above said untill the 12th day of May next ensuing the date hereof at which time he is to pay the said fifteen Pounds fifteen Shillings & three Pence besides the Coast then the Bill of Sale to be void & Else to remain in full force & Virtue

June 13th 1772 there was a Bill of Sale Given by Moses Brindle to Stephen Carr for ye sum of Twenty Pounds in which of said said Brindle Does Set Over & Deliver unto ye said Stephen Carr all his Real & Personal Estate VIZ one Pair of Oxen of a Red and white Culler white faces & pretty wide horns & one thousand ¹¹/₁₆ lbs. of den & three thousand of Bread Barrel Steves one feather Bed two Blankets one covered one Bed Stead & Bed Cord two Barrels & some Cloath for a Quilt & Cloath for a Ground one silk handkerchief one Yarn and a half of Callies - the true intent of this Bill of Sale is that all the above Goods & Chattels are Really Stephen Carrs till the full Twenty Pounds is all Paid with all ye Interest or cost if any should happen this is the free Act and Deed asworn my hand and seal in ye Presents of us
