the Part whereof is hereby acknowledged one Sorrel Horse two
Cows one Black with a white face the other Reddish with
a streaked back all now in possession of the said John Cox
to have and to hold said one Sorrel Horse and two Cows
hereby sold against the claim or claims of any person or
persons whatsoever which said one Sorrel Horse and two
Cows the said John Cox doth put the said Jacob Wood in
full possession of before the signing and sealing hereof it
is further agreed that the said Cox hath Equity of Redemp-
tion untill the first Day of March next ensuing the Date
hereof provided he the said Cox pay the above said sum
of fifteen ^{pounds} three shillings and one penny with the Lawfull
Interest from the first Day of July 1704 untill paid
at said at said period in witness whereof I the said
John Cox Doth hereunto set my hand and seal
this 9th Day of February 1705
