may untill paid have sold and Doth hereby Sell convey and  
confirm unto James Sharp his heirs Executors administrators and  
assigns one Black horse with a Star in his Forehead fourteen years  
old <sup>a light soul with a bald face seven years of</sup> last past and all his house hold Furniture & To Have and  
To Hold the said Two Horses above said and other Furniture unto the said  
James Sharp his heirs and assigns provided nevertheless that if the  
said John Brown his heirs Executors administrators Do will  
and Truly pay or cause to be paid unto the above named James  
Sharp his heirs or assigns the sum of Ten pounds with the  
Interest above said on or before the first Day of December  
next then this Bill of Sale to be void and of no effect  
otherwise to be and remain in full force witness my hand  
and Seal the Twelfth Day of January 1788
