

At a Town meeting held at the New City Haven  
 Decemr 1<sup>st</sup> 1788. Resolved that no person shall be entitled  
 more than one shilling & third poundage for Hogs taken  
 in his or their Enclosure and if Dispute shall arise the  
 Justice the Damages they shall be ascertained by two suffi-  
 cient freeholders chosen by the Parties and if necessary the  
 to Choose the third man & further if the said Hogs shall  
 be sufficiently yoked and troyed the person Agrieved may  
 Call upon any two of the Justice Men who shall  
 Determine whether the person soounding shall be in-  
 debted to pay Damages & Poundage and further it is ordered  
 the Duty of every person that shall take out Hogs at the  
 Common to both York and Troy them any law way  
 or Custom to the Company notwithstanding —

Also that no man shall take any more than  
 one at large from this Day until next town  
 meeting each person so offending shall pay to  
 the Owners of the poor of this Precinct twenty shil-  
 lings and further that no man shall be permitted
