 About ten or eleven years Now remaining & being in possession of
 Laid Andrew Van Orden to have & to hold all & singular the said
 Goods Viz one ft Bellows one vice one anvil one sledge two hammers
 & all his Chisels one rasp one scru Plate two ft Tonges & Gun Board
 All the tools & Emplements of a Blacksmith Likewise one white horse
 Aged 10 or 11 years and every of them by these presents bargain'd & sold
 unto the s^d John Coleman his Executors administrators & assigns for
 Ever and I the s^d Andrew Van Orden for myself my Executors
 Administrators all and singular the s^d Goods unto the s^d John Coleman
 his Executors Administrators and assigns against me the s^d Andrew
 Van Orden my Executors administrators and assigns & against
 All and every other Person and Persons shall and will warrant &
 forever Defend by these presents of which goods I the s^d Andrew Van Orden
 have put the s^d John Coleman in full possession by delivering
 him one white horse as above at the sealing & delivery hereof in
 Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 17th of May
 one thousand seven hundred and eighty six
